

ALLEGED MURDERERS TO THE CAMDEN BAR

Three Prisoners Will Appear for Trial at the April Term of Court Beginning Next Tuesday

With the opening of the Camden court for the April term on Tuesday, arrangements will be made for the trials of three alleged murderers. The most important will be that of Charles Ford, who shot and killed Mrs. May Effie Wagner, at Laurel Springs, about a month ago, besides badly wounding Robert Wilson. Ford is still in the Cooper Hospital suffering from self-inflicted wounds of the head.

William Grædwell will be tried for braining Mrs. Martha Gillian, his boarding mistress, in her home on Cooper street, several weeks ago, while Stefano Torcesso will have to take his chances with a jury for the fatal stabbing of Nunzioto Imperatò in a quarrel over an Italian damsel.

In view of the many lines of work taken up by the grand jury, whose labors have just ended and which was summoned by Sheriff Nowrey, there is much interest in the personnel of the second panel of grand inquisitors which will be selected with the opening of court. It is not believed that Judge Garrison will have anything of importance on which to charge them.
