

OVER IN CAMDEN.

* Ex-County Detective Patrick Gallagher has been appointed captain of the watch at the Philadelphia Mint.

* On a charge of stealing \$37 from Norman Simmons, with whom he boarded, Henry Hill was held for trial by Justice Cassidy.

* The suit of William J. Thompson against Frank Fath, involving the ownership of property on the Gloucester beach occupied Judge Miller's attention in the Circuit Court yesterday.

* After searching for a week the police captured Coraques Diafro, who is charged with setting fire to a property from which he was ejected. Mayor Westcott committed him for trial yesterday.

* Failing to pay fines amounting to \$100 for selling liquor illegally, William Banks, a saloon-keeper, of Beach and Erie streets, was committed to the county jail yesterday by Mayor Westcott.

* Constable James Hunt, a Republican, has been appointed a Fish Warden for Camden county by the new non-partisan State Fish Commission. The other warden, William Guttridge, is a Democrat.

* While returning from a funeral Police-man Hicks saw a crowd of twenty young men "shootin' crap" at Mt. Ephraim avenue and Lemon street. He hopped out of a carriage, scooped in the stakes and captured 17-year-old Walter Gibbs.
